




The SDC is a mandated function of the Office of Planning (OP) set in place by a memorandum of agreement between the Census Bureau and the District of Columbia government with a vision to:

- Deliver accurate and timely population information;
- Prepare and provide training and assistance;
- Assist the Bureau in achieving its mission;
- Foster two-way communications with the Bureau on data usability, data users needs and operational issues.

To help communities, state governments, and federal programs, the US Census Bureau gathers information about:





American Community Survey

- A large national survey that uses continuous measurement methods to produce detailed population and housing estimates each year
- Designed to produce critical information that was previously collected in the decennial census





- Employment, payroll, sales, industry type, and business owner demographics


Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics

 Employment, earnings, and job flows at detailed levels of geography






The General Counsel's role

ENTERPRISE DATASET INVENTORY TIMELINE

- May 4: Mayoral Order 2017-115, District of Columbia Data Policy Announced
- June 5: AISO and ADO selection process complete and reported to OCTO. (Section IV B and D)
- June 14: Data Inventory tool distributed

- December 11: Agency contributions to the Data Inventory must be complete.
- March 11, 2018: Data Inventory is published as Level O, Open
- Future, updated data inventories will be published on November 1 of each year.
